SUMMARY STATEMENT: This ordinance is to appropriate funds from the Vehicle Fund Balance to acquire emergency equipment for the new vehicles purchased during this fiscal year. Through competitive pricing the department was able to purchase 4 vehicles this fiscal year. This allows the upgrade of the department fleet and elimination of vehicles with over 9 years of patrol service—well past the recommended time for patrol vehicles. These funds would complete the emergency equipment needed to deploy the new vehicles.

The department has gone to more energy efficient lighting, and although the initial investment in equipment is higher, the maintenance and life span of the equipment is better. Equipment would include a set of winter tires for each vehicle, lighting, striping, and labor to complete installation.

The department has sufficient funds in the vehicle fund balance for this purchase.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Amend the FY-09 Police Department Budget by transferring \$30,000 from the Vehicle Fund Balance to the Vehicle
