Summary Statement:

The City of Wasilla appropriated funding for health care premiums through it FY2017 budget process. At that time, the City was self-insured with a tiered rate structure (i.e., lower cost for individual, highest cost for family).

In July 2016 the City moved away from the self-insured model and has transferred coverage to the bargaining unions of Operators Local 302, Laborers' Local 341, and Teamsters Local 959. These trusts use a flat rate premium structure.

Finance has reviewed the deficits within departments and is requesting a redistribution of monies within accounting funds to resolve any over expenditures being reflected.
