I have held 4 supervisory positions within the Federal Aviation Administration. As a supervisor, I attend staff meetings to coordinate daily and future budget activities that affect the unit and work directly with employees to resolve conflicts that arise. I use telecoms and unit meetings to monitor the budget process and act proactively in solving any issues. I am directly responsible for the expenditure of taxpayer dollars and I do my best to execute the budget with this in mind.

As a supervisor I interface with multiple offices and organizations within the FAA as well as outside organizations. I foster and promote a good working relationship with our customers (Air Traffic, telephone companies and regional office personnel) as well as my unit employees.

I represented the Region on the Wide Area Augmentation System (WAAS) from June 1994 to October 29, 1996. This system is a new space-age navigation system and will eventually replace the present NAVAIDS that are in place at present. I also worked closely with the International Branch at the Regional Office on the Air Traffic Services Inter-Facility Data Communications System (AIDC) prototype project, used by the Anchorage Center and the two Russian Air Traffic Control Centers to transfer Air Craft via data link. This enables the two centers to communicate more efficiently without language barriers. When this system was installed, we also installed a voice circuit to Petropavlovsk-Kamchtsky (PK). For the first time PK and Anadyr have telephone communications between the two centers. With this new system in place, Alaska Airlines and United Airlines have been able to open new air routes to the Russian Far East.

I coordinate maintenance and operational activities with other FAA personnel (local, regional, and national), private sector and military agencies, to insure continued systems operations. In addition to the duties that are required as a National Airspace Operation Manager I have been involved in two major projects at the Anchorage ARTCC, the redesign of the Alaska Region Maintenance Control Center and a team member on the Advanced Technologies and Oceanic Procedures (ATOP) program. I have also filled in temporarily as the supervisor for the Turnagain SSC. As the Project Lead for the MCC redesign, my main goal was to insure that the construction phase was completed without any service interruptions

As the President of our homeowners' association, I have been involved in setting up the annual budget over the last 12 years. This involved holding meetings with the other members of the board and going over all the expenditures of the previous years and predicting the approximate spending for the coming year. We have dealt with unexpected expenditures and performed audits on our accounts. With our hard work, close oversight and cost savings our dues were reduced by 10 to 15 percent each year for over 6 years.
