Summary Statement: This resolution is proposed to provide funding to improve a portion of Togiak Avenue where the grade is greater than 10 percent. Togiak Avenue is a gravel road that accesses properties from Fairview Loop. Gravel fill is needed to improve the road grade (hill) to make it less steep for vehicle traffic. This funding will be used to haul in new gravel for the road base and improve drainage along a couple of creek crossings.

Funding for this project is proposed from the Riley Avenue Pathway project. This project was initiated to improve pedestrian access from the Senior Center to Knik-Goose Bay Road. This project was subsequently found to need additional right-of-way from adjacent properties to fully meet pathway requirements. Subsequently, an alternative pathway route was identified off the north end of the Senior Center parking lot that can access the Knik-Goose Bay Road pathway at very little cost. The administration will assist the Senior Center in pursing this option and the referenced pathway funding will not be needed.
