Dear Chief Belden,

As you are probably aware, the Alaska Police Standards Council (APSC) currently does not have the funding to pay for ALET students who attend the DPS Training academy, and as a result, municipal agencies will now be paying for the training directly. Our Alaska Law Enforcement Training (ALET) program is affiliated with the University of Alaska, Southeast, and as a result, students who attend ALET receive 16 undergraduate credits. In order to maintain this affiliation, billing has to go through UAS, although all of the tuition (except a \$50 administrative fee) ultimately goes to the academy. In the past, when APSC was paying, the payment went directly from APSC to UAS and then to us. It is because APSC is no longer providing the funding that you are now receiving a bill from UAS for your employee's ALET costs.

While it may seem wasteful to pay UAS for college credits, especially if your employee already has a degree, I assure you that it is not. The funding received through this program is critical to our program's success. The money we receive from the legislature is about enough to pay basic salaries and keep the lights on. It would not cover overtime, travel (for my staff or guest instructors), vehicle maintenance and replacement, building and equipment upkeep, ammunition, etc. If we were to eliminate our affiliation with UAS, I would simply need to raise our overall tuition to get us back to near our current level in order to remain operational. In essence, the college credits are a free benefit of attending ALET, although I recognize that the credits do not benefit all students equally.

In the event that APSC has funding available at the end of the fiscal year to reimburse departments for recruits who have successfully completed ALET, that reimbursement will be handled between APSC and your department.

I appreciate your patience and understanding as we navigate these uncharted waters. There are sure to be issues that come up along the way, but I am confident that with patience and perseverance, we will find our way to reach our end goal, which is highly trained, professional officers who are better prepared to serve your community.
