Summary Statement: The Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly adopted Ordinance Serial Nos. 19-029 and 19-041, and Resolution Serial Nos. 19-021 and 19-028 in support of funding through E911 surcharge revenues, capital projects to include:

E911 Equipment:

- New monitors for each dispatch workstation
 - o 7 monitors for each of the 9 workstations
- Genova Keypads which will integrate into the workstation 911 phone system to create a more user friendly and cleaner workstation for the 911 system
- Keyboards to update and replace the keyboards throughout the dispatch center

E911 Training Simulator – Microdata Phone System which will create a training environment in a class room setting that new hires can practice and become familiar with phone operations off the live dispatch floor and can make mistakes and pause the simulations as opposed to training in a real life emergency setting.

Backup PSAP - Backup PSAP software, hardware, professional service, and shipping and handling refers to the equipment that will be necessary to create our backup dispatch room at the new PD next year.

Smart 911 System – this system will enable the WPD Dispatch Center to obtain precise cell phone caller locations, provide text from 911 to any cell phone, and provide facilities information that may be helpful in an emergency.
