Project Description - As outlined in the grant application.

The Veterans Wall of Honor was established by the Mat-Su Valley veterans in 1992 and it was located at the Mat-Su Convention and Visitors Bureau off the Parks Highway. The Wall of Honor is more than a memorial, its purpose is to honor persons serving in the armed forces past and present with approximately 2,400 engraved names listed. The Wall of Honor was relocated in 2018 to a new site in Wasilla as Phase 1 of the relocation project, that included seven (7) concrete walls containing four 3-foot by 3-foot engraved granite panels on each side. This included clearing and excavation of the new site, sidewalks, new flag poles, lighting and foundation for a future pavilion.

Phase 2 began this year that added six (6) new concrete walls for future engraved granite panels. The final phase 2 element is the construction of a pavilion with seating for 250 people that will be used during annual Memorial Day and Veterans Day events.
