<u>Deb Remus</u>; Mrs. Remus is opposed to the closure of Melanie Avenue.

<u>Harold Newcomb</u>; Mr. Newcomb urged Council to notify all affected property owners, prior to making any decisions on the proposed closure of Melanie Avenue.

<u>Jeff Williams</u>; Mr. Williams stated the closure of Melanie Avenue will not help, closing the street will only create problems on other streets. He urged Council to come up with a long term solution, like the paving of Church Road.

Cia Dreves; Mrs. Dreves spoke in favor of the issue. She stated the residents of Melanie Avenue in the Upper Wasilla Heights and Wasilla Acres Subdivisions came before the Council in February, asking for relief from the problem of the volume of traffic on Melanie Avenue. She understands the Comprehensive Plan addresses the issue of north/south travel, east/west travel. It is our (Melanie Avenue Residents) contention that when the three subdivisions, Upper Wasilla Heights, Wasilla Acres, and Northern Capitol Estates, were platted, it was not intended that Melanie Avenue be a major east/west artery. The reason that we (Melanie Avenue Residents) came before Council was, summer/dust was coming. She understands that is dangerous to access the Parks Highway from Church Road. Once the light was installed at Lucas and the Parks Highway, everyone that should we used Church Road, took Melanie Avenue, through to Lucas so that they could use the light. She faults every single person who drives over 25 m.p.h. on a rainy day and those who travel over 15 or 20 m.p.h. on a sunny day on Melanie Avenue, for having no regard for the people who live there. There are many health issues associated with the dust control problem. Melanie Avenue is a mile long, and has all the traffic from Melanie Avenue, subdivisions from Recluse, Mystery, Success, and the traffic from Mission Hills. Mrs. Dreves urged Council to help the residents of Melanie Avenue, and close the road temporarily to through traffic.

<u>Lynn Dotty</u>; Ms. Doughty supports the closure of Melanie Avenue. She reported definite speed problems, and urged Council to take some action.

<u>Jonathan Allen</u>; Mr. Allen stated he has suffered health problems as a result of the dust problem on Melanie Avenue, and will have to sell his property if it continues. He also stated dust, and paving are not the only issues. The high speed in which vehicles travel is also major concern.

<u>Richard & Ricky Blackwell</u>; Mr. Blackwell and his son Ricky spoke in favor of the closure of Melanie Avenue. The dust problem and speeding are the major concerns.

<u>Vito Papsidora</u>; Mr. Papsidora stated the City needs to address the dust control problem. However, closing the road is not the answer.

Lynn Dotty; Ms. Dotty suggested perhaps the solution would be to place a radar sign on Melanie Avenue.

<u>Harry Dreves</u>; Mr. Dreves stated his major concern is with the speeding traffic. The dust does not bother him as uch as others, he feels safety and speed are definite problems.

Kelly Allen Mrs. Allen supports the temporary closure of Melanie Avenue.

No other comments were made, Mayor Palin closed the public hearing on the temporary closure of Melanie Avenue.

10. COMMUNICATIONS:

A. IM. No. 97-34; Knik-Goosebay Waterline Cost Update;

Jack Felton, Public Works Director, Mr. Felton reported that Administrations efforts were successful, and the City Wasilla is a prime candidate, and first in line for a new water program. Mr. Felton contacted the A.D.E.C., presentatives, and will meet with them tomorrow. They assured Mr. Felton that the City is eligible for the full amount, and recommend the City go forward with the project, and not worry about the financial end. The bond issues do not have to go before the public when the enterprise funds are the recipient. Council approved that the

water fund is an enterprise fund, and it's borrowing the money. The loan payments will be made out of the water fund, so the only vote left to the Council is to enter into the contract with the A.D.E.C.

Councilwoman Langill stated for the record, "I was the maker of the motion to go forward with Mr. Felton's recommendation. However, through my own fault, I guess I did not ask the right questions, I was under the impression that we were speaking to a bond, that would go on the ballot, and be approved by the voters. My mistake."

11. COMMISSION REPORTS:

No Commission reports were given this evening.

Councilman Carney requested Commission Reports be scheduled on the agenda after Persons to be Heard, beginning with the next regular council meeting, 06/23/97. No objection, so ordered.

12. <u>STAFF REPORTS</u>:

<u>John Cramer, Deputy Administrator</u>; Mr. Cramer reported that the negotiations with Matanuska Utility (M.U.C.), re being finalized. The dollar amount (\$75,000.00, the maximum amount authorized by the Council) has been eed upon, and the details of the transfer and actual completion of the sale are currently being worked on.

<u>Erling Nelson, Finance Director</u>; Mr. Nelson commented on the Melanie Avenue and Church Road situation. He stated that since Church road is going to be paved, the City of Wasilla needs to began lobbying the State for the installation of a traffic light at the intersection of Church Road, and the Parks Highway.

<u>Jack Felton, Director of Public Works</u>; Mr. Felton reported that the estimate for the Mystery improvement from the gate to Bumpus to Lucas is estimated for total cost \$701,500.00. The Public Works Department is also beginning a maintenance program for storm drain systems, road crews work from 4:00 p.m. to 12:00 a.m., as they are working low traffic peak hours, with less disruption to the public.

<u>Mary Ellen Emmons, Library Director</u>; Mrs. Emmons thanked Council for their support of the summer reading program. She informed Council that a work-session with the Borough Assembly has been scheduled for June 19th, at 6:00 p.m. in the Borough Assembly Chambers.

<u>Charlie Fannon, Police Chief;</u> Mr. Fannon stated he supports the idea of a traffic light at the intersection of Church Road and the Parks Highway. The parking at Wonderland for the Air Show went off without a problem, and did not interfere with any of the functions happening at Wonderland.

Marjorie Harris, City Clerk; Mrs. Harris reported there is another work-session scheduled for Thursday, June 12th, 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., with the Planning Commission, Parks & Recreation Commission, and the Trails Advisory Committee. Packets for the work-session are available in the Clerk's Office.

AUDIENCE COMMENTS:

<u>Marilyn McGUIRE</u>; Mrs. McGuire reported that the air show was successful. The only complaint some people seemed to have was the requirement to ride the busses to and from the show. She believes the Museum broke even. Approximately 2,800 adults were in attendance, and 400 children.



Councilman Fuller stated he will be out of town until June 26th.

Councilwoman Langill noted for the record, the minutes were very difficult to read this time, and thinks it needs to be clearly stated on the vote, how the vote ended up, and if the Mayor did break a tie, it should so state.
