#### 5 **PUBLIC HEARING:**

Ordinance Serial No. 96-69; FY-96 Budget Amendment; (Deputy Administrator and Α. Parks Seasonal Positions Salaries).

Mayor Palin opened the hearing to the public.

<u>Jeff Heck;</u> seasonal Parks and Recreation employee and a Wasilla resident ask Council to seriously look at the employees suggestions and feed back, and justifying two full positions seems a waste. Feels that there is incompetence in what he has seen. He stated that it is foolish to spend \$20,000 on Parks and Recreation people year round. Residents are not getting the most bang for their buck.

<u>Pat Hjellen</u>; questioned the salary picture. Mr. Nelson explained that special salaries in the mayors office are not tied to a specific person. Planning salaries left over are unused salaries.

<u>Jana Griffin</u>; Parks and Recreation Department stated she has been working seasonally since 1988 being off in the winter months and returning in the spring. She finds that to be very unorganized and a 9 month position or full time would allow more organization. Would be more effective and efficient with two people working. Ms. Griffin hopes the City will invest in it's Parks and Recreation Department and give it a chance to work.

Ken Langlois: Parks and Recreation Department stated that the depot door is in fact closed and locked from inside and the building is holding heat at 50 degrees.

<u>Katie Carney</u>; expressed concerns that the positions will be \$42,000 not \$21,000 as presented for the full time positions. She encouraged the Council to look at this issue realistically. Don't try pulling the wool over the public's eyes, people are smarter than that. Do winter projects all at once, fund up ont.

<u>Kaye Sloan</u>; agrees with Ms. Carney, need 2 people full time but don't have the funding to carry full time people.

No other comments were made. Mayor Palin closed the hearing to the public

Councilman Carney requested a job description for the Deputy Administrator, Parks and Recreation positions and an organizational chart. Also requested a summary of winter projects for the Parks and Recreation employees.

- F. May Good Spoke about the adults and kids working together to raise funding for the skate board park at the Old Wasilla Airport Site. They will be seeking funding in the amount of \$14,000 for the next step of architecture
- G. Georgia Boadman said that John Waters owns Quality Sand and Gravel and he may be able to volunteer his trucks and even some of the materials.

<u>John Cooper</u> is a volunteer for the project and stated that Ken Wormhode is a specialist in this field. The park would be good for the kids in the area. Kids plan to sell iron and concrete. There would be no liability for the City.

<u>Kaye Sloan</u> The \$5,000 funded by the City was used for a model in clay. The completed project is estimated at a cost of \$100,000, with his fees being 16%. Phase 2 at \$8,800, Phase 3 at \$1,600, currently over budget at \$600.
