Summary Statement: From July 14, 2020 through December 15, 2020 the City of Wasilla has offered four different phases to assist the City with Coronavirus relief. The programs offered have been small business grants, personal protective equipment grants, housing relief (i.e., both mortgage and rental assistance), and utility relief. The financial information referencing the amounts provided through these grant programs are listed below:

Administration now wishes to offer an additional round of Personal Protective Equipment Grants as part of Phase V that would mirror that of Phase IV, specifically including for-profit and nonprofit entities located within the City of Wasilla. If adopted, the program would be offered from February 9, 2021, through March 19, 2021. This will allow the City to assess the current COVID19 impacts to the City of Wasilla through March 2021.

Proposed Action: Adopt Resolution Serial No. 21-04.

Personal Protective Equipment Grants Phase V

Personal Protective Equipment grants will reimburse for-profit and non-profit entities with a bricks and mortar location of operation within City limits up to \$5,000 each for direct costs incurred to provide personal protective equipment for employees or customers during the COVID-19 public health emergency. Funding from these grants used for eligible expenses do not need to be repaid.

Qualifying entities must be in good standing and holding an active business license with the State of Alaska and the City of Wasilla. Entities must not be in bankruptcy proceedings or have filed a request to close operations with City or State of Alaska. Entity has not received funding during previous phases of the Personal Protective Grant program. Or, if an entity has received previous funding under earlier phases, entity must submit invoices demonstrating use of previous grants on eligible items.

Grant funds must be solely used for expenditures that occur between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2021 and examples of eligible expenditures include the following:

Masks, gloves, incremental cleaning and sanitation supplies, deep-cleansing service (excludes routine cleaning done in the ordinary course of business), plexi-glass or similar product for social distancing, COVID-related signage

Applicants must specify how the grant funds will be used. Additionally, applicants will be required to assert the following:

- Application is true and accurate.
- Knowledge of federal guidelines and eligible use of funds
- Retention of records showing how funds were

- expended.
- Prompt production of records upon request by the federal government, State of Alaska, or City of Wasilla.
- Requirement to return unspent funds or funds used for unauthorized purposes.
- Requirement to return funds if business closes or files bankruptcy prior to receiving funds or business fails to reopen within 60 days following the date grant funds are distributed.
- Signor holds authority to legally bind the entity.

The application period will be open for from February 9, 2021 through March 19, 2021 or until designated funding has been exhausted, whichever is shorter. The review committee shall begin processing applications upon receipt to determine completeness and eligibility based on the program requirements. Approved applications shall be batched with payments distributed weekly.

To expediate the distribution of funds, applications will be processed on a first come, first-serve basis. Submission of an incomplete or inaccurate application may result in ineligibility for program funding. Corrected applications may be resubmitted for consideration at any time during the application period. The City is committed to timely review and processing to ensure that recipients can use these funds to continue making our community safer.

The City reserves the right to publish names of businesses receiving grants and the amounts received. Any document deemed a public record by law or by Wasilla Municipal Code is subject to disclosure in response to a request.

The City reserves the right to amend the criteria or procedures of this program as may be required to conform to state or federal guidelines.

Personal Protective Equipment Grant Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

The City of Wasilla is providing a Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Grant Program – administering federal CARES Act funds for the reimbursement of protective equipment and supplies due to COVID-19 public health emergency.

Does my business qualify?

- May be a for-profit or non-profit entity.
- Must be bricks and mortar location within the City limits;
- Has not received PPE grants from previous phases (I, II, or III) of the program <u>or</u> entity must submit invoices demonstrating use of previous grants on eligible items.
- Must be licensed with the State of Alaska and the City of Wasilla.
- Must be in good standing with the City of Wasilla. A business with a City lien or balance due for sales tax would not qualify unless the balance owed is under an approved payment plan and payments are determined to be current.
- Must not be in bankruptcy proceedings or filed an intent to close operations with the City of Wasilla or State of Alaska.

What is used to determine if the entity has a bricks and mortar location within the City limits?

The physical location of an entity is reflected on its City business license. If that physical address is inside the City limits, the entity would be considered bricks and mortar for the purpose of this program.

How long will the program operate?

The application period will begin February 9th. It will end March 19, 2021 or until the dedicated funds have been distributed, whichever comes first.

What can I use the funding for?

Purchase of the following items between January 1, 2021 and December 30, 2021 are considered eligible.

- Masks;
- Gloves:
- Sanitation supplies;
- Deep-cleansing, sanitation service, excludes routine cleaning done in the ordinary course of business;
- Plexi-glass or similar product for social distancing;
- COVID-related signage.

What can I NOT use the funding for?

Funding may only be used for the uses expressly noted above. In addition, any personal protective equipment that was paid for by other CARES Act funding would not be eligible under

this grant. Please note that businesses will be liable for any misuse of funds and the grants are subject to audit.

Will these funds be issued as loans or grants?

These are grants and do not need to be repaid if the funds are spent on eligible expenses.

Are there fees associated with these grants?

There are no fees charged to the applicant.

How can I access the application?

You can access the application at https://www.cityofwasilla.com/departments/finance/cares-act.

When can I submit the application?

You can email the application and all required documents to $\frac{\text{covidgrants@cityofwasilla.com}}{\text{beginning February 9}^{\text{th}}}$ at 8:00 a.m. All forms $\frac{\text{must be typed}}{\text{must be typed}}$ except where legal signatures are required.

Will an electronic or typed signature be accepted on the application or W-9 form? No. A physical signature is needed on all forms.

Can I apply for the Personal Protective Equipment Grant if the entity has already received a grant in previous phases of the program?

Entities who have received funding under previous phases are generally not eligible to apply, unless they have a continued need and can provide documentation evidencing that previous grants(s) have already been spent on eligible expenses. That is, entity would need to remit invoices showing use of funds.

What happens if I submit my application before February 9, 2021 at 8 a.m.?

Applications and required documents WILL NOT be accepted prior to 8 a.m. on February 9th. Any attempted email submission before 8 a.m. on February 9th will not be held in the queue and must be resubmitted for consideration.

How many employees do I need to have to qualify for this grant?

For the Personal Protective Equipment Grant, there is no limit or minimum number of employees. This grant is designed to benefit an entity who expended funds to make our community safer with the use of protective equipment.

Is there a required minimum or maximum revenue amount to qualify?

No. This grant is designed to benefit an entity who expended funds to make our community safer with the use of protective equipment.

What documentation do I need to submit?

- Fully-completed application;
- Completed <u>W9 form</u>

• If entity received PPE grants in earlier phases (I, II, III, or IV) of the program and has a continued need, entity must submit invoices to demonstrate use of previous grant funds on eligible expenditures.

What if I submit an incomplete application? Will I keep my place in line?

If an incomplete application is received, the applicant will be notified of the issue regarding incompletion and may be asked to resubmit the fully-completed application with all documentation depending upon the amount or nature of incomplete items. The applicant's place in the queue will not be saved as other completed applications will continue moving forward.

Can Faith Based Organizations or Churches apply?

Yes, if they are licensed with the State of Alaska and the City of Wasilla. Additionally, they must have bricks and mortar location of operation in the City and expend the dollars in accordance with the grant.

If I have multiple locations in the City of Wasilla, can I apply for each location? Yes. If each location is licensed separately and considered a separate legal entity.

If I have applied for other COVID-19 related assistance, can I still apply for this grant? Yes. As long as a business does not recover the same business expense twice, (i.e., using two different funding sources to cover the cost of the same box of masks). Additionally, if you have secured COVID CARES Act federal funding from other sources, you should ensure the terms of those agreement do not preclude you from applying for this grant.

When will I receive my grant funds?

Applications will be processed and funded as quickly as possible on a first-come, first-served basis.

How many businesses will be awarded funds?

Applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Eligible businesses will be awarded grants until all dedicated funds have been disbursed or the application period has expired.

Is there a physical address where I can mail or drop off my application?

Yes. You may mail or drop off your application to City Hall – Finance Department at 290 E Herning Avenue, Wasilla AK 99654. Hours of operation are Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm. A drop box is also available and checked regularly throughout the business day.

How much is the grant award?

An entity may request up to \$5000.

Is a franchise eligible for this grant?

Yes. The business must have a bricks and mortar location of operation in City limits and expend the dollars in accordance with the grant.

Is the electronic data that I submit secure?

If the applicant prefers to submit data securely, it is the sole responsibility of the applicant to submit through a secured or encrypted format. Once data has been received by the City of Wasilla, all data at rest is stored off-site, on a cloud server in a secure format.

Who will be reviewing the grant applications?

An extensive first-come, first-served process has been established involving City staff and contracted professionals. The process includes several stages of management review and oversight.

What information and documentation submitted with the application is subject to public disclosure?

Any document deemed a public record by the State of Alaska or the City of Wasilla Municipal Code is subject to disclosure in response to a public request. The City reserves the right to publish business names and award amount if desired to promote transparency.

Who can I contact for assistance with the application?

If you need assistance with assessing your eligibility or compiling the needed documents for your application, we advise that you consult with your financial or legal advisors. For general questions about the program, please contact us at covidgrants@cityofwasilla.com.

How can I find out the status of my application?

Applications are reviewed in the order they are received by our review team. Once an application is submitted, you will receive a confirmation email that your application has been received and is under review. After all documents are reviewed for completion and accuracy by our team, you will receive notification through email concerning the status of your application. An application may be rejected or returned for one or more of the following reasons: the business is ineligible under program terms; information provided in required documentation is inaccurate, and/or; the application or required documentation are incomplete. In the event that the application was rejected but the business is eligible, your notification of status will clearly identify the reasons for returning the application and you will be able to resubmit a new application with the required adjustments if the application period is still open. Due to the large number of anticipated applications, we will not be providing individual updates of application status. As email will be the only method of communication, be sure to review the email address provided on your application for accuracy.
