Section 1. Classification. This ordinance is of a general and permanent nature and shall become part of the Wasilla Municipal Code.

Section 2. Amendment of Subsection. WMC 5.20.050(C)(2), within Allocation of costs, is hereby amended to read as follows:

2. Other Streets. The city council <u>may</u> shall assess at least one-third of the total cost of street improvements to the assessable benefited properties and may fund no more than two-thirds of the costs for the <u>street</u> improvements of streets designated on the official street classification map as minor collector, commercial and local/residential class streets.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption.

Summary Statement: This code change is proposed to allow flexibility is when a Limited Improvement District (LID) is created for street improvements. More specifically, the Wasilla Municipal Code requires an LID be formed in all cases for street improvements to local roads or "other streets". The city's proposed paving plan would require the formation of LIDs in all cases for paving local roads.

The administration believes the city's paving plan should move forward without the requirement for forming an LID. The City's paving plan is proposed for dust control and reduced road maintenance. If street lights, storm drains, or sidewalks are proposed as part of the local street improvements, then this code change would allow an LID be formed based on input from the benefited properties.

Proposed Action: Introduce and set the Ordinance for public hearing.
