IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARK USERS

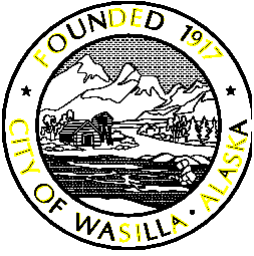

Ample parking is available at all City of Wasilla Parks. Vehicle are to be within the designated parking areas only. **NO VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED IN THE PARKS.** Person found in violation of this could be subject to a \$250.00 fine pursuant to WMC 12.24.25. There is potable water at Lake Lucile Park.

PARKS RULES

No person may cut, pick or damage trees, flowers or other vegetation.

No person may camp without a permit in a designated area.

No person may have an open fire or camp stove unless in a designated area.

No person may possess or consume any alcoholic beverage without a permit.

Animals need to be on a leash or under restraint and feces removed.

No person may deposit litter, waste, or wastewater on the land or in the water.

No person may sell goods or services without a vendor permit.

No motorized vehicles allowed.

Park hours are from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm unless extended by permit.

Permits for the above items can be obtained from the Department of Public Works. Permits can be processed in 5 working days when all the required information is provided.

Park Use Permits for pavilion use can be processed in 2 working days and are processed on a first-come basis. The intent of a park use permit for pavilions is to designate a time and place for small events, but the permit does not provide exclusive access to the pavilion. Park users are intended to share facilities as needed to accommodate multiple users.

Park hours are from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm and park users are expected to control or limit loud noises in the morning and evening hours when neighboring private property can be affected. The City's goal is to ensure park use is safe and fun for all users and surrounding properties.
