

Wasilla resident Rodney Raymond Cottle, 81, died after a two-year battle with Leukemia on Aug. 5, 2013, at his home on Lake Lucille.

"It is what it is" became his approach to life and to deal with opportunities as they come your way. His final moments were spent overlooking Lake Lucille with family and grandchildren playing around him — this was his last request and with many in the community it was accomplished!

A memorial service will be held at the First Presbyterian Church of Wasilla with Pastor Henry Woodall officiating at 3 p.m., Aug. 11 with a reception following at 4 p.m. at the VFW.
