

**WASILLA PLANNING COMMISSION
RESOLUTION SERIAL NO. 09-12 (AM)**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE WASILLA PLANNING COMMISSION MAKING
RECOMMENDATIONS ON THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM.**

WHEREAS, The Wasilla Municipal Code 2.60.010.B.8 states that the Planning Commission will investigate and prepare on an annually basis recommendations on a capital improvement program; and

WHEREAS, The Public Works Director has prepared capital improvement recommendations for consideration by the Planning Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wasilla Planning Commission hereby recommends the following:

- 1) The water and sewage utility will develop additional capacity over the next five years to support additional growth.
- 2) Gravel road paving will continue to reduce maintenance cost and improve air quality within the City limits.
- 3) The administration will continue to work with the State and Borough to develop and improve the following major arterials to reduce traffic congestion: Main Street Couplet; S. Mack Drive Extension; Hermon Road Extension; Seward Meridian Extension South; Knik-Goose Bay Road/Fern Street Intersection Improvements; Lucille Street Rehabilitation; Swanson Avenue Rehabilitation Main Street to Crusey Street; and Nelson Avenue Rehabilitation Lucille Street to Weber Drive.

- 4) Update the Airport Master Plan to include the following projects: Primary Access Road; Navigational aids for instrument approach; Apron Expansion and Runway Extension to 5,000 feet.
- 5) Improve existing parks for the following users: Iditapark for all age groups; Nunley Park for small children; Wasilla Lake Park for swimming and ice skating; Carter Park for small children; Bumpus Ballfields for baseball, softball, soccer, and trails; and Lake Lucille Park for camping, fishing, ballfeilds, and trails.
- 6) The administration will continue to work on improving water quality in Wasilla Lake, Cottonwood Creek, Lake Lucille and Lucille Creek.
- 7) Update the 1996 Comprehensive Plan.
- 8) Improve pedestrian access along roads by means of sidewalks and pathways especially in residential areas within the City Limits.


