SUMMARY STATEMENT: Resolution Serial No. 10-21 designates sewage treatment plant improvements as the number one local funding priority for fiscal year 2012. Completed questionnaires must be received no later than **5:00 p.m. August 2, 2010** to be considered for funding. After the August 2nd deadline, a review period will be allowed for communities to review their preliminary scores for comment. No additional information will be allowed during this period with the exception of a community council/assembly resolution designating a project as the community's number one state priority project. This review period will take place the week of August 23rd, final comments and a resolution must be received no later than 5:00 p.m., August 27, 2010.

As a reminder from last year's questionnaire solicitations, we have added new features to the on-line questionnaire process. One of the new features added allows you to revisit an already submitted questionnaire as needed to make changes during the open solicitation period. The effective submission date of the questionnaire will be the final date submitted. Another feature added allows you to copy repetitive information (i.e. name, address, etc.) from one questionnaire onto a new questionnaire. This feature was added as a means of reducing the amount of typing needed when filling out additional questionnaires. A final added feature increased the timeout period for inputting a questionnaire, which now is up to one hour.

We would appreciate receiving any comments you may have on your experience working with the on-line questionnaire submission system. Your comments are valuable to us for making future improvements to the questionnaire process. We look forward to hearing from you.
