SUMMARY STATEMENT: The original contract was awarded by City Council in 2008 to R&M Consultants, Inc. in the amount of \$284,077 based on the City's Request for Proposal RFP-0691-0-2008. This contract has been funded with a legislative grant from the State of Alaska in the amount of \$300,000. The original contract was awarded with the knowledge that additional funding would be needed to complete the engineering services. The Alaska Department of Transportation has made additional funding available in the amount of \$450,000 through Ordinance Serial No. 10-26 based on a review of the R&M proposal.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: Authorize Mayor to execute a contract amendment with R&M Consultants in the amount of \$310,240 for Knik-Goose Bay Road and Fern Street Intersection engineering services using Alaska Department of Transportation funding.

R&M Consultants Inc. (R&M) requests an amendment to complete the design of the Fern Street Intersection Improvements. As you are aware the project has increased significantly in scope which has had a corollary impact to R&M's budget. Following is an overview of the additional work that was not anticipated.

Project Overview

The original project scope was to design for a new traffic signal installation with a minimum amount of road widening sufficient to accommodate left turn pockets. R&M had anticipated that the road reconstruction required for the intersection improvements would involve a total length of about 1500 feet. In November, 2009 the final Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) Report was completed. The TIA described the types of improvements necessary for a traffic signal to function adequately at this location and what the DOT&PF would likely require on this State route. The report was formally approved during the Plan-in-Hand plan review held on January 7, 2010. In order for the new signal to operate adequately (considering delay, level of service and safety) under the forecasted traffic volumes, the TIA recommended designing multiple southbound lanes on KGB Road (about ½ mile in each direction from the existing Fern Street intersection) resulting in a multilane intersection design. As the design process evolved to incorporate these recommendations, the scope of the project and estimated construction costs increased (\$1 million to \$5 million). This expanded project scope has resulted in the following changes and increased our level of effort.

Task 3.1 - Preliminary Engineering Report

Content and detail required for the Preliminary Engineering (PER) and Utility Conflict (UCR) Reports has increased. With the multilane and widened roadway sections, there are significantly more impacts to the existing pathway, residential and commercial approaches and utilities which had to be addressed with the design.

Task 3.2 – Environmental and Public Involvement Activities

Additional environmental activities associated with increased project scope include additional analysis of anticipated roadway impacts, expanded review, comment and approval process for the Environmental Checklist for State Funded project by the DOT&PF.

Task 3.3 - Final Design

Plans, Specifications, and Estimate (PS&E)

The recommendation to multilane KGB has evolved into a design optimization effort, balancing the need to minimize impacts to existing facilities and right of way, while preserving the roadway function and intersection operation. Our level of effort and detail has increased primarily in the following areas:

- KGB typical sections,
- Pathway relocation,
- Approaches (residential and commercial),
- Drainage
- Traffic Control and Construction Phasing

KGB typical sections

Under the planned improvements, the existing KGB southbound (SB) traffic lane will become the new left turn lanes. Incorporating the TIA's recommendations, the new edge of pavement will be approximately 30-feet offset from the existing pavement edge, effectively doubling the size of SB KBG. The 1-mile of widened roadway has resulted in extensive modeling to engineer the pathway, cut/fill slope limits, ditch and roadway typical sections to be in accordance with the principles of roadside safety.

Pathway relocation

With the wider KGB roadway, there is less space available to fit the separated pathway. As a result, approximately 2,800-feet of pathway had to be optimized to reduce utility impacts and avoid the need to acquire right of way. The separated pathway and KGB typical sections had to be engineered together to develop a complete and accurate roadway model to assess impacts, approaches and drainage.

Approaches

Eight approaches on the north side of KGB Road required redesign to accommodate the additional lanes and relocated pathway. Each approach has been engineered to meet the DOT's minimum requirements depending on the type of approach (residential or commercial). In addition, each approach will have to be permitted as discussed under Task 3.5.

Drainage

With the widened roadway, the existing drainage network of roadside ditches and culverts required reconstruction to current standards. The proposed drainage elements aim to improve the area's drainage with increased capacity (enhanced ditch geometry) and new culverts (24-inch vs. existing 18-inch). In addition, there is proposed ditch grading at Knik Tire and Auto to improve drainage flow through this low lying area.

<u>PS&E</u>

R&M had estimated 28 drawings for the completed plan set as originally planned. With the increased project scope approximately 60 plan set drawings will be required for bid advertisement.

Additional tasks include:

New Task -- Task 3.4 Utilities

With the increased widths and lengths of the planned improvements, greater coordination among the individual utilities is required. Additional meetings, coordination, plan and cross section reviews, and design alternatives to minimize impacts without compromising roadway function and operation are required.

Preparing Utility Agreements

Additional and more detailed utility agreements are required. Based on the December, 2009 initial utility meeting, individual agreements are anticipated from the following utilities; Enstar, MTA, MEA, and GCI. A separate utility agreement will be required for the signal load center. Subconsultant Raven Engineering has prepared an estimate for coordinating and preparing the required individual utility agreements.

Review by DOT&PF Utility Section

During a December, 2009 meeting with the DOT&PF Utilities Section, it was communicated that the DOT must be involved with any agreement concerning funding, placement, relocation and or adjustment within its right of way. The level of involvement includes agreement reviews, utility design (relocation and or adjustment) reviews, plan assembly reviews, and project certification. All formal written communications with individual utilities, including agreements must be prepared for DOT signatures before release.

New Task -- Task 3.5 - Right of Way

The original scope didn't include budget for meeting with property owners adjacent to the project and discussed how the project would impact their property and or approaches. This face-to face could be consider part of the public involvement subtask, but is better linked to design tasks since there are detailed communications (written and phone) accompanied by exchanges of engineered drawings.

In addition, each approach will have to be permitted by the DOT&PF's Right of Way Section through the Approach Road Review process. For example, to date we have spent a considerable amount of time communicating with Mr. Randy Harman (he owns the property opposite Fern Street) about the project and its impacts.

We are within one week of submitting the Pre-PS&E plan assembly to the DOT&PF for review. Attached is a budget breakdown of additional work completed to get the plans to this point of development as well as an anticipated cost to complete the design. A review of our files shows that our contract expired in June 2009. We respectfully request an extension under this amendment to December 2010.

CITY OF WASILLA ORDINANCE SERIAL NO. 10-26

AN ORDINANCE OF THE WASILLA CITY COUNCIL ACCEPTING AND APPROPRIATING STATE OF ALASKA, DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF \$450,000 FOR KNIK-GOOSE BAY ROAD AND FERN STREET IMPROVEMENTS.

Section 1. Classification. This is a non-code ordinance.

Section 2. Purpose. To accept and appropriate \$450,000 in State of Alaska

Department of Transportation Funding for Knik-Goose Bay Road (KGB) and Fern Street

Improvements.

Section 3. Appropriation. The funds are appropriated to the following:

KGB & Fern Street Imp 160-4320-432.45-41 \$450,000

Section 4. Source of Funds.

KGB & Fern Street Imp 160-4300-334.30-65 \$450,000

Section 5. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption by

the Wasilla City Council.
