SUMMARY STATEMENT: Wasilla Meta-Rose Public Library was awarded \$2,000 from Target for the 2012 Summer Reading Program. This is a motivational reading program that encourages youth aged birth-18 to read through the summer to maintain reading skills. Through programming and library staff encouragement, children are helped to find books that they really want to read, instead of being told what to read. Program participants are expected to read a minimum of eight books per week or complete two hours of weekly reading. The \$2,000 will be used to purchase reading incentive prizes.
