Summary Statement: The administration is seeking to improve the City's ability to respond in an area wide emergency by purchasing and maintaining above ground gasoline storage tanks for the Police and Public Works Department. The Public Works Department currently operates and maintains a 2,500 above ground diesel fuel tank for heavy equipment.

The cost for one 1,000 gallon fireguard, skid mounted, double wall gasoline tank meeting all regulatory requirements with dispensing system is between \$17,000 and \$20,000. This is the first phase of purchasing at least 2 tanks over the next year that will be used on a regular basis for daily fueling to keep the fuel fresh, and be available in an emergency to maintain essential services for at least a week.

The other benefit is to reduce annual fuel costs by buying bulk fuel for both the Public Works Department and Police Department.
