A RESOLUTION OF THE WASILLA PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION SUPPORTING THE WASILLA ROTARY CLUB IN ITS EFFORTS TO CONSTRUCT A TRAIL FROM THE WASILLA MULTI-USE SPORTS COMPLEX TO LAKE LUCILLE PARK.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wasilla Municipal Code (WMC) 2.64.010.A, the purpose of the Wasilla Parks and Recreation Commission is to advise the city on matters pertaining to parks and recreation facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Wasilla Rotary Club that has a long history of community service projects; and

WHEREAS, some of the projects include improvements to the Hatcher Pass visitor area, shaken baby awareness training, polio vaccination drives and roadside litter cleanup; and

WHEREAS, an important project on their list is to pursue the designation, design and construction of a multi-purpose trail from the Wasilla Multi-Use Sports Complex to Lake Lucille Park; and

Whereas, this trail would potentially provide a link between the Knik-Goosebay Road and the Parks Highway bike trails; and

WHEREAS, this link would connect miles of existing trails and could potentially act as a route for the Iditarod re-start; and


WHEREAS, easements, land acquisitions, materials and equipment are needed to construct this trail; and

WHEREAS, the Wasilla Rotary Club is seeking grants, donations and other volunteer assistance to construct this trail.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Wasilla Parks and Recreation Commission support the efforts of the Wasilla Rotary Club in acquiring the necessary funds and volunteers in order to construct this important trail.


