WHEREAS, Matanuska-Susitna Valley resident Chandra Wilson-Sutton has identified a need to establish Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) type large animal emergency care in four regions of Alaska; and

WHEREAS, large animal emergency care to FEMA standards will require supplies and trained teams; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Wilson-Sutton needs to raise funds to purchase the storage units, supplies, and training needed to meet FEMA standards for large animal emergency care; and

WHEREAS, the means to raise funding for this important cause is a *Pony Express*, *Alaskan Style!* reenacting the carrying of mail between a Palmer Post Office and a Wasilla Post Office; and

WHEREAS, the inaugural event is scheduled for July 27, 2013 and riders are being recruited and proper permits are being obtained to hold the event in an attractive, inclusive, and safe manner; and

WHEREAS, funds will be raised by purchase of \$7 Pony Express stamp and envelope which will be transported by Pony Express, hand cancelled, and mailed to the addresses by regular mail; and

WHEREAS, other forms of fundraising like rider registration, sponsorships, and donations may also be used to raise funds; and

WHEREAS, the *Pony Express, Alaskan Style!* will also provide a fun event for the horseback riding community and the classic vehicle community in the Mat-Su Valley and South Central Alaska; and

WHEREAS, the ride is dedicated to the pioneer homesteading heritage of the Mat-Su Valley and those that helped build the Valley into the wonderful community that exists today; and

WHEREAS, the *Pony Express, Alaskan Style!* ride will be a unique and fun event to attract participants, participant families, residents, and visitors alike to Wasilla for the finale of the 12.5 mile ride between the Palmer and Wasilla Post Offices; and

WHEREAS, organizers of the *Pony Express, Alaskan Style* desires support from the City of Wasilla for what is hoped to be an annual event to support a worthy cause to benefit an important segment of the Matanuska-Susitna Valley community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Wasilla City Council supports the *Pony Express, Alaskan Style!* event scheduled to end in Wasilla on July 27, 2013 and wishes the organization much success in its fundraising efforts.

It will also create a membership drive for participating riding association (association) and bring in cash for other needs for the association (like animal food and legal fees if needed). Proposed dates and details

The Pony Express, Alaskan Style will be held on Saturday, July 27, 2013. Segments will run from the Palmer Post Office to the Wasilla Post office (12.5 miles) for the first event planned. Future routes in other regions are being developed for Anchorage, Kenai, and Fairbanks. Additional regions can be added easily depending on the interest, weather conditions, and support available.

This is for competent riders only. Remember to condition your horse in the weeks before the ride. This is a vigorous ride. The mail carrier must average 6 miles per hour. This is an express.

Advance sign up is mandatory. For insurance reasons, all participants must be members of (riding association to be determined) with a current liability form on file with the association (membership and forms will be available to you if you need them – let us know!).

Riders are asked to wear period clothes, walk with a limp and spit with western authenticity and charm.

Take Part in History: Send Mail by Pony Express, Alaskan Style!

- Purchase your \$7 Pony Express stamp and Envelope.
- Address your envelope and add your personal greeting to the letter.
- Mail your letter in a Pony Express Mailbox.

Your letter will travel via Pony Express horse and rider from Palmer to Wasilla, AK. After entering Wasilla all letters will be specially hand-cancelled and enter into the regular U.S. Mail to be delivered as addressed.

These commemorative letters are a great collectors item. Address letters to friends, family members, or servicemen.

Mailboxes will be located at: Pony Tail Tack Shop, Bear Mountain Tack, Pet Zoo Wasilla and Palmer. (Tentative spots I would suggest)

Planning Meetings, (Locations, time, and date TBD)

On Saturday, July 27, 2013, the Pony Express, Alaskan Style Mailbags will travel via one route, leaving the Palmer, Cobb Street Post Office and traveling 12.5 miles (5 hours 2 mins. walking time estimate) arriving the same day in Wasilla at the Wasilla Post office on the corner of 401 N Main Street.

The ride is dedicated to the Pioneering Spirit and the Grand Marshals of the 2013 Celebration. The (pioneer icon TBD), are homesteaders who were among the early Pioneers who helped make the Mat-Su Borough a community. (Insert history here).

We hope this will be a community wide event – all riders are welcome to participate. Anyone officially entering (carrying the mail or part of a posse) must be a member for insurance purposes and sign a liability waiver. All official Pony Express riders must have completed membership/rider forms in order to participate.

For those not able to ride an actual leg of the Pony Express, Alaskan Style, another option will be available so you can join the riders as they turn in the mail.

If you are interested in helping out with this event, PLEASE contact Chandra Wilson –Sutton ASAP. Even if you can't make the meetings, we need your help! We will be putting together groups to work on all the areas needed, so get your name in and lend a hand! Call for directions to the meetings or just to show your interest!

Rules for Riders

For insurance reasons all riders must be association members with a current liability form on file with the association. Riders who have not paid their entrance fee and submitted liability form cannot be a part of the Pony Express, Alaskan Style.

This is an all ages event. Town Drunks will be jailed and paraded through town to the pokey.

Entry Fee:

\$35.00 association Members

\$45 Non-Member (Includes 2013 association membership).

Family rate \$25 for second rider in a family and \$10 each for the rest of the family members participating.

Riders may receive a Pony Express Alaskan Style Rider Badge, a commemorative bandana, and a rider certificate. If you have an "Old West" alias such as "Deadshot Darla" or "Jumping Bean James" please make sure to include it on your signup sheet so we can put it on your rider certificate.

Riders are asked to wear period clothes, walk with a limp and spit with western authenticity and charm. We will provide some websites for period clothes. We can arrange for a rider accident so you can walk with a limp, and will have spitting lessons at the breakfast.

There will be more than one rider signed up for each section. The riders will go as a posse. However, one Rider will be assigned as the mail carrier and must maintain a pace of at least 6 miles per hour. This is an express. There will be several hundred people waiting in Wasilla for the mail.

Riders who plan to ride the whole trail need to provide their own escort across bridges, etc. This is an express and the association cannot hold up the mail to provide an escort for riders that cannot keep up with express riders.

Please be at your checkpoint 20 minutes prior to your departure time ready to ride in case the preceding rider gets there early. If you get to a checkpoint and the next rider is not there, at the scheduled time, consult with the checkpoint deputy and call Chandra Wilson-Sutton. Do not alter alter your route, you must be at the assigned checkpoint and the assigned time.

Bring water and snacks for yourself and your horse. Hoof pick, halter, and lead rope as well.

Trailer parking will be limited. Please "trailerpool" when possible. No horse is to be left unattended at any checkpoint. Please make sure that you have adequate transportation for you and your horse to your starting point and from your final destination.

Horses must be in good physical shape. If your horse is sick, lame, or excessively underweight they will be disqualified to participate. There will not be a refund.


