SUBJECT: Canvass Board Report, Regular Election, 10/06/92

As required by CW 4.16.060 the Canvass Board hereby submits this report of their findings in reference to the Regular Election of October 6, 1992. Numerical and percentage results are shown on Attachment "A".

On election day election judges had no time for breaks in either precinct, beginning the day at 6:30 a.m., opening the polls at 7:00 a.m. and closing the polls at 8:00 p.m. After polls are closed the judges then have to count the names on each register, one for the Borough and one for the City, count and record the number of questioned ballots, personal representative ballots and spoiled ballots for both the Borough and the City, count the number of unused ballots and record all information on forms provided by the Borough and the City. After all ballots have been accounted for, the unused ballots are torn in half and the City ballots are placed in an envelope to be returned to the City and the Borough ballots are placed in an envelope to be returned to the Borough. After this has been completed, the ballot boxes are opened and ballots are sorted, City from Borough and questioned ballot envelopes and personal representative envelopes are checked against their registers for both the Borough and the City and placed in envelopes to go to either the Borough or the City. The regular voted ballots are placed in boxes, one for the City ballots and one for the Borough, sealed with a tamper proof seal and signed by each judge. The chairman takes control of the sealed box of voted ballots and turns them over to the receiving line and gets a receipt for the ballots.

Each time a voter has to vote a questioned ballot, it takes between 10 and 15 minutes to assist that voter. With the growth in both City precincts and having to operate 2 elections simultaneously, Borough and City, the canvass board is recommending asking for one more judge for each precinct for elections.

The Canvass Board recommends certification of the election results for the October 6, 1992 Regular Election as shown on Attachment "A".
